

Other Population Changes

Due to unavailability of yet to release data from 2020 PSA Census of Population and Housing, the planning team use the latest available of data from the Community-Based Monitoring System 2020-2021 Census for the following population information to establish the population changes of the city: (a) Ethnicity, (b) Religion, (c) Literacy, and (d) Other Relevant Information.

Marital Status

The City of General Trias has a total of 356,516 population with ages 10 years old and over based on the Community-Based Monitoring System Census on 2020-2021. Out of which, 45.60% or 1662,571 are single while 35.17% or 125,393 are married. The remaining 19.18% are distributed to the following classifications: widowed, divorced or separated, and common-law or live-in; while 0.05% have unknown marital status (see Table 1)

Mother Tongue / Ethnicity

Ethnicity or ethnic group is a category of people that are socially defined based on social experience or ancestry. Being a member of an ethnic group is relevant to the cultural heritage of the people, their ancestry, history, homeland, dialect, or even ideology. Further, they can also be a representation of symbolic systems such as religion, mythology, ritual, cuisine, their dressing style, and physical appearance.

According to the recorded number of ethnic groups in the city, there are 122 language and/or dialects spoken in the City of General Trias. As presented in Table 2, majority of the household population or 69.32% (298,562 people) use Tagalog as their primary dialect at home followed

by 11.58% (49,865 people) who use Caviteño as dialect at home. This can be attributed to the geographical location and close proximity of the City to Metro Manila.

Some of the households in the city originated from the far northern and southern provinces. Thus, other languages and dialects are also being spoken in the city including Bisaya/Binisaya (25,239 people), Bicol/Bicol (16,486 people), Hiligaynon/Ilonggo (7,005 people), Waray (6,891 people), Ilocano (5,592 people), Pangasinan/Panggalato (2,702 people), Cebuano (2,687 people), and Kapampangan (1,461 people).

Religious Affiliation

Religious affiliation refers to a particular system of beliefs, attitudes, emotions, and behaviors constituting man's relationship with the powers and principalities of the universe. Based on the latest CBMS Census, the city has 90 religious' affiliations of which totaled to 429,843 individuals (99.80% to total household population) while the 865 individuals (or 0.20%) has no religion. Nonetheless, it is apparent that majority or about 91.26% of the population in General Trias are Roman Catholics including the Catholic Charismatic. It is followed by 2.55% of the population that are Iglesia ni Cristo, 0.81% are Islam, 0.71% are Alliance of Bible Christian Communities of the Philippines, and 0.58% are Filipino Assemblies of the First Born, Incorporated (see Table 3). Moreover, there is a total of 147 religious' establishment in the City of General Trias (see Table 4).

Literacy Rate

Literacy rate is the percentage of the population 10 years old and over, who can read, write and understand simple messages in any language or dialect. Being literate improves one's future in the society, as well as contribute in the development of self and the community.

The data on the literacy of household population in the General Trias is presented in Table 5. Based on this data from the CBMS 2020-2021 Census, 98.35% of the total population 10 years old and over are literate and a bigger share of this are males. On the contrary, there are about 5,888 persons, or 1.65% of the total population 10 years old and over, were recorded as illiterate.

Other Relevant Information (In-migration, OFW, etc.)

In-migration / Migration Pattern

Households choose to stay or move to a different place to satisfy their basic needs. Factors such as price of housing units, economic opportunities (i.e., job with higher income), availability of basic services, and natural hazards affect the migration pattern. Households tend to stay in areas where they feel more secure, while they tend to move to a different place of residence if they will benefit more from doing so.

According to the 2020-2021 CBMS Census, out of 430,708 population in General Trias, 88.81% or 382,522 individuals who were 3 years old and above have stayed in the city for more than 3 years already, and the 19,873 have stayed in other city/municipality or other province before moving in General Trias (see Table 7). Also, there is a record of the population (6,989 individuals) who do not specify their previous residence. In spite of this, as General Trias transitioned from being a municipality to a first-class city last 2015, in-migration may have occurred due to the possible economic opportunities that the city has to offer.

Overseas Workers / Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW)

According to Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), an overseas worker is a household member who is currently out of the country due to overseas employment. He/she may or may not have a specific work contract or maybe presently at home on vacation but has existing overseas employment to return to. Undocumented overseas workers are considered as overseas workers for as long as they are still members of the household and had been away for less than five years. However, immigrants are excluded from the census.

Based on the latest CBMS census of the city, out of the 430,708 population, there are 3.35% or 14,432 who are currently out of the country due to overseas employment. In which there is more male OFWs with 9,627 over female OFWs with 4,805.

Education has a positive externality as it is one of the strongest instruments for poverty reduction, health improvement, gender equality, and peace and stability (World Bank).

Whether formal or informal, education can influence one's personality and life. It is composed of various stages including preschool or kindergarten (pre-elementary), elementary school, secondary school (junior and senior high school), and college, university, or apprenticeship.

Based on the latest city census (see Table 8), out of the total population 5 years old above (394,886 individual), 98.38% or 388,496 have studied in school and the remaining 1.62% or 6,390 individuals do not receive any educational attainment. It is evident that majority of the population have finished/ graduated in high school (old and K-12 curriculum) with 29.50% to the total population with highest educational attainment, followed by the population who are college graduate with 17.15%.

Food and Poverty Threshold

Poverty Incidence is defined by PSA as the proportion of families/individuals with per capita income/expenditure less than the per capita poverty threshold to the total number of

families/individuals. On the other hand, poverty threshold is the minimum income required to meet the basic food and non-food needs such as clothing, fuel, light and water, housing, rental of occupied dwelling units, transportation and communication, health and education expenses, non-durable furnishing, household operations and personal care and effects.

Poverty incidence in Cavite was estimated at 3.7 percent in 2018 (see Table 9). It can be interpreted as approximately four out of 100 families in Cavite did not have sufficient income to meet their basic food and non-food needs in 2018. In General Trias, the estimated poverty incidence in 2018 is 3.8 (see Table 10).

Poverty threshold in Cavite, on the other hand, is Php 29,157.00, it is higher than the country's Php 25,813.00 and region's Php 27,928.00 thresholds. This implies that the cost of living in Cavite is generally higher than the most areas in the Philippines, as reflected by the lower poverty threshold in the national line (see Table 11).
