HUNTCIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 5-93

AN ORDINANCE COVERING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS IN THE OPERATION OF THE GENERAL TRIAS PUBLIC MARKET TO BE KNOWN AS "1993 MARKET CODE OF GENERAL TRIAS, CAVITE".

CHAPTER I

SCOPE OF DEFINITION

Section 1. POWER TO ESTABLISH

The Sangguniang Bayan of General Trias has the power to establish and maintain Public Market of any kind within the limits of the Municipality of General Trias.

Section 2. PUBLIC MARKET

Shall be those which have been established, designated and/or authorized by the Sangguniang Bayan of General Trias and shall embrace the whole plot of ground intended for or assigned to such market site, as delineated by their respective technical descriptions, location plans, subdivision surveys, building plans and other documents on file in the Office of the Municipal Treasurer and the Municipal Engineer.

Market - is a Public Market where it is dedicated to the service of the general public and is operated under the control and supervision as a public utility whether it be owned by the government or any instrumentality thereof or by any private individual.

- A. Government owned and/or operated public markets are those established by any public funds or those leased or those acquired by any other legal modes or means from private persons, natural or juridical and operated by the government.
- B. Privately owned and operated public markets are those established by private fund and operated by private persons, natural or juridical, under government franchise.
- C. Market Stall shall refer to any allocated space, stand compartment, store or any place wherein merchandise is sold, offered for sale or intended for such purpose in the public market. The numbering, designation or other forms or identification of those stalls shall be done in accordance with the standard plan already approved or which may be approved by the Sangguniang Bayan.
- D. Market Sections shall be known as the classification of stalls according to the kind of merchandise offered for sale therein.

The following shall be the classification of market sections:

- 1. Fish Section
- Fresh fish, clams, oysters, crabs, lobsters, shrimps, seaweeds, and other seafoods and marine products.
- 2. Meat Section
- All kind of fresh meat from cows, carabaos, horses, goats, sheeps, swines, meat and fowls.
- 3. Dry Good Section All kind of textiles, ready made dresses and apparels,

toiletries, novelties, shoes, laces, kitchen wares, utensils and other households articles, handbags, bars, school and office supplies and the likes.

- 4. Grocery Section All kind of cakes like biscuits, crackers, etc., butter, cheese, confectionaries, candles, canned or bottled foods, beverages, softdrinks, flour, rice, oatmeals, ham, bacon, sugar, nuts, sauce, onions, garlic, potatoes, eggs, toilet articles, sausages, corn, mango, starch, smoked fish, dried fish, salt, soap and other household or food products, including firewood and charcoals.
- 5. Vegetable & Fruit All kind of vegetables and fruits and root crops Section such as camote, cassava and the like.
- 6. Eateries & Cooked All kind of cooked foods including refreshments and cakes where foods is served.
- 7. Poultry Products Chickens, ducks, birds, duckling, etc. Section
- 8. Flower Shop All kind of flowers, fresh and artificial flower pots, vascs.
- 9. Cold Storage All kind of goods or products kept in freezer and/or refrigerated containers.
- 10. Footwear Section Shoes, slippers and the likes.
- 11. Cigarettes Section Cigars, (tobacco), cigarettes and the likes
 - E. Unauthorized Merchandise No person shall sell, offer for sale or expose in the market like dog meats, flammable materials and combustible materials.
 - F. Meat As herein used refers to fresh meat from cows, carabao, horse, goat, sheep, swine and fowls slaughtered in the municipal or private slaughterhouse.
 - G. Carabao and Horse Meat It shall be unlawful to maxi carabao or herse meat with cows beef or misrepresent the former as beef. For this purpose, a separate and distinct compartment for carabao and horse meat shall be provided. A stall holder in the meat section may be allowed to lease a stall in the carabao and horse meat through his/her helpers such privilege as an exception to the provisions of Section 6 of Chapter IV of this ordinance.

CHAPTER II

SUPERVISION AND CONTROL

Section 1. MARKET SUPERVISION

There shall be one Market Supervisior for all public market who shall be in-charge of the market to which he is assigned. He shall be the

custodian of all properties belonging to the market and have immediate administrative supervision control over all subordinate market employees where he is assigned. The Market Supervior and his subodinate shall see to it that stallholders and transient vendors are provided with the corresponding regular and special tickets for the stall or place occupied by them on any particular day. He shall see to it that the market to which he is assigned is efficiently operated and that all subordinate market personnel assigned to his market perform their duties properly.

Section 2. LOCAL REVENUE COLLECTION CLERK

There shall be a Local Revenue Collection Clerk under the supervision and control of the Funicipal Treasurer or authorized representative who shall take charge of his distribution of work and the proper performance of the collection work by the Market Collector under him, and the strict adherance to the rules governing the collection fees, licenses and other dues from persons engaged in business in markets.

Section 3. MARKET INSPECTORS

There shall be Market Inspector, who upon specific orders and direct supervision and control of the Municipal Treasurer, shall make inspection of cash tickets issued to Market Vendors and make report to the Municipal Treasurer or his authorized representative for instruction on his work assignment and business submission of reports.

Section 4. UNIFORMS, WEARING OF ID CARD

Market Supervisor, Market Inspector, Market Collectors, Guards and Market Cleaners shall wear uniform and identification card while on duty for easy identification which shall be prescribed by the Municipal Treasurer with the approval of the Municipal Mayor.

Section 5. CARRIERS (CARGADORES) IN THE PUBLIC MARKETS

No person shall engage in the calling of a carrier in any public market unless he is a good moral character and registered such as in the Office of the Municipal Treasurer abd has not been convicted for any of the the crimes against property. Each carrier shall be provided by the Municipal Treasurer with registration certificate and an identification card, which he shall waer conspicuously while working as carrier. The Market Supervisor shall have the power to fix the number of carriers in each public market, certifying the needs of the market for such number of carriers. No carrier registered in one market shall act as carrier in other markets except upon prior authorization from the market supervisor. Any registered carrier convicted of crime against property subsequent to his registration shall be automatically disqalified as carrier and his name shall be dropped from the list of carrier kept in the Office of the Municipal Treasurer.

Section 6. COLLECTION

All collections of stall fees, regular or special fees from truck carrying merchandise, the collection of Mayors Permit Fee and License and other fees due the government and all accounting work incident to market operation are hereby vested in the Municipal Treasurer. Under His/Her direction, such work shall be performed by the Local Revenue Collection Officer, Market Supervisor and other personnel duly authorized by him/her.

CHAPTER III

CLASSIFICATION

Section 1. For purpose of this Tode, markets are hereby classified as:

CLASSIFICATION OF VALUORS INSIDE THE MARKET - The vendors shall be group into different sections in accordance with the goods, wares or merchandise sold therein as follows:

1. Fish Section

7. Vegetable Section

2. Meat Section

8. Eating Place Section

3. Dry Goods Section

9. Poultry Products Section 10. Flower Shop Section

4. Grocery Section

5. Sari-Sari Store Section 11. Dealer of Cook Food Section 6. Fruit Section

Section 2. No person, partnership or corporation shall operate a privately owned/operated public market without securing approval from the Sangguniang Bayan as provided for under Section 1 of this ordinance. All stall holders engage in any form of business in a privately owned/operated public market must secure a permit or license from the Office of the Municipal Mayor before operating its establishment. Privately owned/operated public market shall be classified as follows:

A. those having 100 stalls or more

B. those having 80 stalls to 99 stalls C. those having 50 stalls to 79 stalls D. those having 30 stalls to 49 stalls

E. those having less than 30 stalls

The rental, lease or fee of government owned operated public market Section 3. shall be determined by the market committee and as to the manner of payment whether permanent lease or not, whether the stall holders open or not for business and whether the merchandise, goods, wares or commodities are displayed directly or indirectly to public view and whether sold or not, provided that individual stallholders of public market shall be subject to the payment of permit and licenses as provided or required of their respective business except those ambulant vendors selling fresh fish and vegetables who shall pay an annual mayors' fee. Furthermore, trucks and other conveyance whether hired or not, parked within the premises and disposing or discharging merchandise or advertising products shall also pay the corresponding fee.

Section 4. SUPERVISION FEE

Privately owned and operated public market including mini-markets and supermarkets shall submit semi-annually to the Treasurer's Office, a certified list of stallholders showing the amount of stall fees and rentals paid daily by each stallholders which report shall be submitted on or before the 20th day of every semester, the graduated business tax as prescribed in the General Trias Revenue Code of 1993 of the gross receipts to the Municipality thru the Municipal Treasurer, as supervision fee. Failure to submit said list and to pay the corresponding amount within the period shall subject the operator to the penalties provided in this code and to such other administrative remedies as may be deemed appropriate including revocation of permit to operate. The Office of the Municipal Accountant shall have the power to inspect and examine the books and operations of all public markets.

CHAPTER IV

AWARDING OF STALLS AND CANCELLATION OF AWARDS

Section 1. MARKET COMMITTEE

There is hereby created permanent market committee compose of Municipal Mayor as Chairman, Vice Mayor as Vice Chairman, Chairman of Committee on Appropriations, Committee on Public Market and Slaughterhouse of the Sangguniang Bayan, Municipal Treasurer, Municipal

Engineer, MPDC, and a representative from the market vendors associations whose duties are:

To conduct the adjutication of vacant or newly constructed stalls or booth in the public market.

To make a study of the transfer of stallholders from one section to another or from one stall to another.

To make a study of all phases of market matters and to submit, comment on and recommend such study to the Municipal Mayor. To inspect and examine books of accounts and operation of any

stallholder.

c). Finutes of the deliberation of the market committee as regarded shall be certified as fair and correct.

Section 2. APPLICATION

Filipino citizen and who are actual residents of the municipality chall be given preference in the award of public market stalls. All application to lease or rent shall filed with the Office of Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator in a form prescribed nerein.

Section 3. ASSIGNMENT OF OCCUPY STALL

- a). No person shall sell, offer for sale or expose for sale, any article or articles in any public market, within the Municipality of General Trias or use or occupy any stall without first having been assigned as such in the manner prescribed in this code.
- Vendors shall be assigned to their respective stalls according to the nature of the merchandise intended for sale.
- c). Dwellings in stalls or any place within the market premises is strictly prohibited.
- d). Any person other than the stallholder or his partner or his registered helpers found conducting beusiness at the stall shall be required to pay rent in addition to the corresponding rents collected from the regular holder of lease, provided, that the payment of such additional rents shall not waive the right of the market authorities to impose whatever penalties may be levied upon the lessee for violation of this provisions, including the revocation of lease.

Section 4. PARTNERSHIP WITH STAILHOLDER

A market stallholders who enters into business partnership with any party after he/she has acquired the right to lease such stall shall have the authority to transfer to his partner or partners provided the partnership is registered to the market committee. Provided further, that in case of death or any legal disability of such stallholder to continue in his/her business, the surviving partner maj be authorized to continue occupying the stall for a period of not more than sixty (60) days within which to wind up the business of the partnership. If the surviving partner is otherwise qualified to occupy a market stall under the provisions thereof, the relative within the third degree by consanquinity of affinity of the deceased shall be given the preference to continue occupying the stall or booths.

Section 5. SUB-LEASING OR SELLING OR PRIVELEDGE TO OCCUPY STAIL PROHIBITED

No person shall be allowed to sub-lease the stall to awarded. A person other than the stallholder found selling in the latter stall is a primafacie evidence of subleasing and shall subject the stallholder to outright revocation of his/her lease award.

Section 6 NUMBER OF STALL TO ONE PERSON TO EXCEED TWO

No person shall be allowed to lease more than two stalls. Provided that when two stalls are leased to one person, such stall shall adjoin one another and shall be located in the same section of the market, and Provided, Further, that it shall be a violation of this section for more than one member of a family consisting of the father, mother, sons, daughters to hold stalls in one market unless these sons, and daughters are already married and with families of their own to support or when they are already living by themselves and independently of their parents.

Section 7. DURATION OF REGULAR LEASE

The regular lease of market stall shall be understood to be continous unless revoked by a competent authority for violation of any provisions of this code or voluntary waiver on the part of the lessee.

Section 8. AWARDING VACANT STALLS

Vacan't and newly constructed stalls or booths shall be adjuticated in the following manner.

a). Notice of vacancy shall be placed or hang above the vacant or newly constructed stalls or booths so as to advise the public of the fact that such stalls or booths are available for lease. This notice shall specify the number of the stall or booth, the section where located and the last day of filing an application for occupancy thereof, The notice of vacancy shall be printed on stiff card-board or other hard materials and should be in the following form.

- b). The above noticed shall remain where it is hang or placed or a period of not less than ten (10) days immediately preceeding date of the award. A copy of this notice shall also be placed on the bulletin board of the market concerned.
- c). The application shall be signed and submitted to the Market Committee by the applicant in person or by his/her Attorney-in-fact and accompanied with two copies of his/her picture, one to be posted on the application and the other on the record card, in case the application is approved. The Market Supervisor shall acknowledge receipt of the application, setting orth therein that time and date of receipt and keep a record book for such purposes.

6. Any violation on my part or those of my helpers of any of the foregoing conditions or any of the provisions of existing market regulation shall be sufficient cause for the market authorities to declare the stall (s), booth (s) vacant so that the same may be lease to other applicants.

Application received by the Market Supervisor shall be forwarded immediately to the Municipal Treasurer or his representative.

Section 9. DEATH OF LESSEE, SUCCESSION

Upon the death of the holder of a stall, the said stall shall be declared ipso facto vacant. However, if the deceased leave surviving spouse or legal heir who is not disqualified under the provisions of this code and who desires to continue the business of the deceased, the leased may be transferred to the deceased legal heir, if qualified lease stall, upon application, provided the Market Committee thru the Market Supervisor shall be notified within a reasonable time about the desire of the heirs to succeed and upon

payment of all necessary rents or fees due at the time of death of the predecessor on the stall prescribed by this code.

Section 10. Stallholders shall not be allowed to occupy stalls or spaces other than leased to them, and it shall be the duty of the Market Supervisor or his authorized representative to see to it that the stallholders do not occupy other stalls or spaces.

CHAPTER V

CENTERAL ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

Section 1. MARKET HOURS

All Municipal Public Markets shall be open from 4:00 AM to 8:00 PM daily. However, on the 24th and 31st of December of every year, all the Municipal Public Markets shall be open from 3:00 AM to 12:00 o'clock midnight.

Section 2. PERSONAL ADMINISTRATION HELPERS

Any person now leasing or who may here after lease stalls in the public markets shall present personally at his/her stall (s) booths (s). Each stallholder may employ not more than two (2) helpers, who must be citizens of the Philippines and physically fit and free from communicable diseases and must be registered to the Market Supervisor and duly approved by the Funicipal Treasurer. The parents, spouse or children of the stallholder who are actually living with him/her need not register under the provisions of this code.

Section 3. ABSENCE OF STALLHOLDERS

Permission to be absent for short duration because of illness or other justifiable cause may be given to stallholder by the Market Supervisor. The absence shall not exceed one (1) month for every year of occupancy of a stall, but not in no case to exceed three (3) months. During the stallholder's absence, one of his/her registered representative shall be authorized by him/her in writing to continue the business, otherwise, the lease contract of stall be terminated by the municipality.

Section 4. LOSSES OF STALLHOLDERS

The Municipality of General Trias shall not be responsible for any loss or damage which stallholder may incurr in the market by reason of fire, theft, or force majeure. Any merchandise, goods, wares, or commodities left in the markets during closure time shall be at the risk of the stallholders.

It shall however, be the duty of the Market Supervisor and his subordinate to exercise utmost vigilance and care to prevent any losses in the market. For this purpose, the Market Supervisor and his subordinate shall have the authority to apprehend and turn over to the police any persons caught stealing or committing offense in the markets.

Section 5. ABANDONED ARTICLES

All articles abandoned in any market in violation of any provision of this code or of any regulation or rule relating to the management of the markets, shall be the duty of the Market Supervisor and his subordinates to take custody thereof. In case the articles are claimed within twenty four (24) hours there after, they shall be returned to their safekeeping, unless they have so determined as to constitute a menace to public health, in which case, they shall be dispose of in a manner directed by the Municipal Treasurer,

who may also in his direction, cause the criminal prosecution of the guilty party, or merely warn him against future violation. If the articles have not deteriorated and are not claimed within the time herein fixed, said articles shall be sold at public auction and the proceeds thereof disposed of in accordance with law.

Section 6. PEDDLING AND HAWKING

No person shall peddle, hawk, sell, offer for sale, or expose for sale any articles in the passage ways of aisles in any market.

Section 7. LOAFING, LOTERING, BEGGING, ETC.

No person not having lawful business in or about any market shall idly sit, lounge, walk, or lie in an on the premises of the same, nor shall any person beg or solicit contribution of any kind in any market.

No person shall annoy or obstruct market employees in the discharge of their duties, nor shall parents allow their children to play in or around their stalls or in the market premises.

Section 8. DRINKING LIQUOR, WINE OR ANY INTOXICATING DRINKS PROHIBITED

No person shall drink serve or dispense liquor or any intoxicating drinks within the premises of any market in General Trias at any time of the day. Any violation thereof shall subject the offender to the penal provisions of this code or other existing ordinances and if the violator (s) is/are stallholders, his/her lease award shall at once be revoked.

Section 9. WEIGHT AND MEASURE

The privelege to engage in business in the markets granted to any vendor who is found violating the provisions of National Internal Revenue Code regarding weight and measures, shall be immediately withdrawn his lease cancelled and the stall declared vacant and open for application in addition to the penalties impose by the said code.

Section 10. LOOSE AND ALS

No dogs or other animals shall be left astray in any market and the larket Supervisor is hereby empowered to catch such stray animals and impound them in the Municipality of General Trias for disposition as in the case of animals impounded therein.

Section 11. MAINTENANCE OF ORDER IN MARKET

No person within the premises of any market of this municipality shall commit any muisance or shall be found guilty of any disorderly conduct, or make any loud or boisterous noises, or use any profane or vulgar language, or stand without business and obstruct the passageway of any market or do any act which is calculated to lead to a breach of peace and tend to disturb the good order and decorum therein.

No person shall carry in his possession deadly weapons, such as knives, bolos, axes, icepicks, darts within the market premises or in case of stallholders or their helpers, outside their stalls.

Section 12. REQUIREMENTS IN PRIVATE OWNED AND OPERATED PUBLIC MARKETS

No privately owned and operated public market building shall be erected within ten (10) meters from the highway, street, road or sidewalk after the approval of this ordinance. The Municipal Engineer is hereby authorized to promulgate rules and regulations

regarding the construction of privately owned and operated public markets and the stall therein. No sale of commodities shall be allowed on sidewalks, aisles or open spaces outside any building or any public market.

Every operator of a privately owned market or before engaging in business as such, and before a license is issued, shall deposit with the Municipal Treasurer surety bond as guarantee that he willstrictly, faithfully comply with all ordinances and regulations and requirements as prescribed herein.

Section 13. Each and every stallholders shall deposit a cash bond to be determined by the Market Committee with the Municipal Treasurer as guarantee that he/she will strictly and faithfully comply with this ordinances and observe all market regulations and requirement, before he may actually make possession of the stall awarded to them. In case he/she violated the previsions of the contract or any pertinent provision of this ordinance or any of the regulation and requirements which may be forfeited in favor of the lunicipal Government.

Section 14. APPEALS FROM DECISION OF THE MARKET COMMERTED

Any person, entity, stallholders directly affected or aggrieved by the decision or action of the Market Committee, may appeal the same whose decision or action thereon shall be final, except if declared otherwise by competent legal authorities.

CHAPTER VI

MAINTENANCE OF MARKETS

The following provisions for the maintenance of public markets established in the municipality shall be carefully and strictly observed.

- Section 1. The Harket Supervisor shall see to it that the market is always kept clean and in a perfectly sanitary condition, including the aisles, divisions, stalls, floors, walls and equipment as well as the whole tract of land belonging to the market. The cleaning of the market premises should be done before the buyer start coming to the market. The market building and grounds should all times be kept free from garbage and rubbish.
- Section 2. Every market shall be provided with a public toilet, one for men and another for women, which toilet shall be constructed in accordance with such plan as the Municipal Health Officer or his authorized representative may furnish and kept at all times in perfect state and in sanitary condition. Toilet as well as the necessary and adequate washing facilities must be located near the market to enable customers to wash their hands before handling the food especially after coming from the toilet.
- Section 3. Adequate general lighting facilities including wires, electric meters shall be provided in the markets. However, stallholders shall pay their own electric bill consumed in their respective stall.
- Section 4. Individual stallholders shall provide themselves with their own trash receptacles and avoid littering their premises.
- Section 5. Cooked foods should be served hot and at all times protected contamination by flies or other insects and dirts. Likewise, raw foods such as beef, fish etc. shall at all times be protected from flies and other insects.
- Section 6. All kinds of foods, whether cooked prepared, raw or natural, should not be unnecessarily handled by the sellers or buyers and

that cooked and prepared food should be service by means of forks, spoons, dippers or similar utensils, instead of with the hands.

- Section 7. The sale of any kind of spoiled foods in bad state of contamination is prohibited in the markets. All spoiled food or foods in the stage of decomposition shall be condemned and destroyed, the Health Officer shall issue the owners a receipt stating the quality of food confiscated. Keeping at the same time, a record of the kind or kinds and the quantity of the food that have been destroyed and the reasons thereof.
- Section 8. No sale of fish or meat or goods which are subject to decomposition shall be made in the public market.
- Section y. All foods shall be sold from stalls, booth, tables or fixtures made of or constructed according to approved plans or designs by the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Health Officer, or their authorized representatives. Those stalls, booths, tables or fixtures should be scrubbed nightly and their surfaces kept smooth always so that foods or particles thereof cannot lodge in cracks or in rough places to decompose.
- Section 10. All persons engaged in the sale and gandling of manufactures or cooked foods, refreshment and drinks, shall at all times be neat and clean and provide themselves with hot towels and cloths for the cleaning of the tables, stalls or fixtures. Likewise, restaurants and carinderias stall always have biling water for washing the utensils such as knives, forks, spoons and similar objects. Equipments, such as wights, cases, seats, etc., should at all times clean and those found to be unclean shall destroyed or substituted upon orders of any authorized representative to the effect that they are not baccili carrier of such diseases and have been vaccinated against small fox, cholera or typhoid fever.
- Section 11. In times of epidemics, such as cholera, typhoid fever, dysentery and the like disease, all persons before being admitted to the market shall be required to wash their hands with a disinfecting solution to be furnished free of charge by the sanitary authorities. During such epidemic, the water ordinarily used in the flushing of the floor of the market should be subsituted by disinfectant solution and the tables, fixtures, and shelves of the market shall also be washed with a like solution.
- Section 12. No imflammable or highly conbustible materials shall kept or stored in any of the stalls in the market without prior written permission from the Chief of Fire Department or his duly authorized representative.
- Section 13. All stallholders shall at all times required to keep to their respective stalls of at least 10 lbs. fire extinguisher except on the wet section of the market.
- Section 14. The cleaning during market hours of the market, stalls including the floor space thereof and all appurtenances thereto, should be done by the stallholders and their helpers. The Market Supervisor may also assign sufficient number of laborers to take charge of the proper cleaning of the market, in order to keep them always in clean and sanitary condition.
- Section 15. At the close of each days, business and before going home, the owners or helpers of any fixed or transient spaces in a market shall clean their spaces, including the floor shelves and area of the electrical wiring or water connection without prior permit from the Market Supervisor.

Section 16. In case of brownout of power failure, stallholders are not allowed to use gas operated of candle light for their emergency lights. Stallholders are allowed to use only battery operated emergency lights on their premises.

Section 17. EJECTED STALLHOLDERS DISQUALIFIED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DROWING

Should a stallholders be ejected from his/her stall for cause as in this code provide, he/she and his/her helpers shall be disqualified from again leasing said stall of any other stall in any public market in this municipality for a period of one year.

CHAPTER VII

PENAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. ADMINSTRATIVE PENALTIES

- a). Any unpaid market fees or rental or other dues subsisting continously for more than ten (10) days from the due date shall be sufficient cause for the automatic cancellation of contract of lease of stalls.
- b). Any unpaid market fees, lease or rentals due after 30 days from the datedue date shall be sufficient cause for the automatic cancellation of the contract of lease of stalls.
- c). A surcharge of Twenty Five (25%) percent on their past due account shall be added to unpaid account of the stall holders.
- Section 2. Any violation of any provision of the code as well as other existing rules and regulation governing the operation of public market, by any stallholders shall be sufficient enough for the cancellation of lease contract and revocation of Municipal Business Permit and license to him/her and of the priveledge to occupy or lease in any stall in a public market.

CHAPTER VIII

Section 1. CEPTINE CLAUSE

All ordinances, executive orders, proclamations and administrative regulations, or part thereof which are inconsistent with this Code are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 2. EFFICITITY CLAUSE

This ordinance shall take effect after ten (10) days from the date a copy is posted in the bulletin board at the entrance of Municipal Hall of published in a local newspaper if there is any and in at least two (2) conspicous places within the lunicipality of General Trias.
